

Learning activities suggested for this lesson are weaving (kinesthetic), singing (musical), map (visual), reading (verbal), small group discussion (interpersonal), and “chain of faith” scripture verse (kinesthetic). Look at the chart “[Seven Preferences for Learning and How to Use Them](#)” for an understanding of the purpose of these resources.

- ◆ If you are adding to the **weaving** during each lesson, be sure to have the loom and any necessary materials on hand. If you plan to complete the weaving in this lesson only, the loom and the warp threads will need to be prepared in advance.
- ◆ If you are singing a theme hymn during each lesson, make sure all participants are familiar with it.
- ◆ Click here for “[Paul’s Ministry in Philippi](#),” “[Lydia and Her Powerful Witness](#),” and “[A Strange Tale](#).” Make copies of each for every participant. Distribute the sheets and divide participants into two groups. Have one group focus on “Lydia and Her Powerful Witness” and the other focus on “A Strange Tale.” As a whole group, share the results of these two discussions. Alternatively, work through the two resources as a whole group.
- ◆ If you have done the weaving (throughout the study or just today), look at it together. Ask, “What do you see when you look at the weaving?” Be sure someone notes that the golden threads/ribbons that represent God are always visible, holding all the stories together.
- ◆ Click here for the “[chain of faith](#).” Print the page and make enough copies for each participant to receive a chain. Copy the page on heavy paper or card stock, size 11" x 17". Cut out the chain of women, curl it to make a circle, and tape the overlapping hands together. Use the circle to surround a candle or a vase of flowers. Distribute the chains and read the scripture together.
